


CONSUMER MEET

THE LEGEND OF RADHA AND KRISHNA

The first and the most popular one is about the love and companionship of Lord Krishna who started Holi by applying color on Radha and the Gopis. The playful colouring gradually evolved as a tradition and later, as a festival observed as Holi, in the Braj region of India.



THE LEGEND OF HOLIKA AND PRAHLADA

The Vishnu legend explains Holi as victory of Good over Evil. Holika, the sister of Hiranyakaship, the ruler of Asuras attempted to kill Prahlada while sitting on fire is attributed with the celebration of Holi, with the pre festival ritual of the Holika bonfire.



THE LEGEND OF KAMADEVA

Mediating Lord Shiva was disturbed by the love arrows of Kamdev and led to the opening his third eye which burned Kamadeva to ashes. This upset both Parvati and wife of Kamadev that ultimately led to Shiva forgiving Kamadeva and restoring him to life on the 40th day from Vasant Panchami. The legend has it that on the day of Holi, in the kingdom of Prithu, village boys displayed their united might and chased an Ogress "Dhundhi "away by a blitzkrieg of shouts, abuses and pranks.



THE LEGEND OF POOTANA

On the night before Holi, there is a practice to burn an effigy of Pootana - the Ogress who nearly killed Lord Krishna. The tradition is symbolic of victory of divinity over demonic forces.
